College Options:

Universities/4-Year Colleges

You should have already applied to your 4-year options but if you have not you need to do so as soon as possible. There are three possible outcomes - Accepted, Denied, and Waitlist. If you are denied or waitlisted, do not give up. There is still time to apply to other colleges which will accept your application.

2-Year Technical Colleges

You should have already applied to your chosen technical college because some of the progam spots fill quickly. However, if you have not applied yet go ahead and apply now.

2-Year Community Colleges

Apply now to any community colleges you are interested in. Community colleges will accept applications ongoing, however the earlier you apply the sooner you can move on to the next steps.

Log into your Scoir Account using Google login and then search in the Discover Careers section of your profile. Follow the prompts to take career assessments or investigate a variety of careers.


The Places Panthers Go

To get your pennant posted on the display, submit all your letters of acceptance from colleges, apprenticeships or military branches to Ms. Auer in the Counseling Center. When you receive acceptance and/or scholarship letters be sure to bring in a copy (or forward the email) of each one. We use this information for our senior awards night and to post your name in the hall. For those attending college, be sure to review your financial award letters for colleges before making your final choice. Once you have decided, let Ms. Auer know where you plan to go and update your SCOIR accounts by going to the Applied column and marking your chosen college as "Enrolling". Once the Counseling Office verifies this has been done, your name with your choice will be added to the wall.

Seniors will report to the auditorium to let their counselors know the specific college or career they have chosen to pursue after high school.
