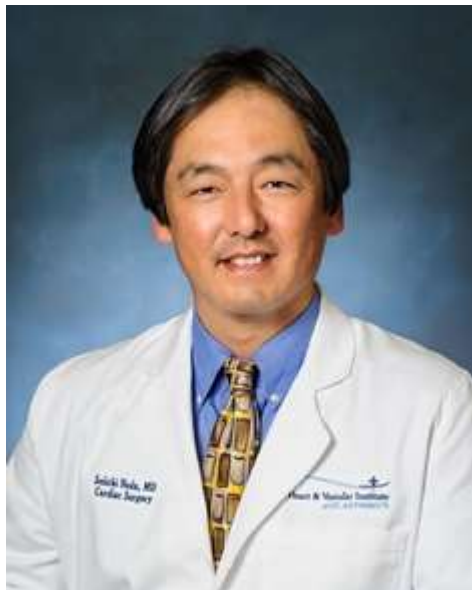

Dr. Noda was one of the first surgeons in the St. Louis area to offer a minimally invasive alternative to traditional open-heart bypass surgery. He is board certified in surgery and in thoracic surgery, is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons, and is a member of the Society of Thoracic Surgeons. He completed his cardiothoracic surgery residency at Washington University in St. Louis and completed his surgery residency at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, Mass., where he also served as an instructor of surgery at Harvard Medical School.



Dr. Young is a neurosurgeon with special emphasis on microsurgery of the cervical and lumbar spine. He is board certified in neurological surgery and a clinical professor of anatomy and neurobiology and neurosurgery at the Saint Louis University School of Medicine. Dr. Young is also the director of the Practical Anatomy Lab at Saint Louis University. He has received recognition from the American Medical Association Foundation for organizing numerous medical mercy missions to Kenya.
