

A quality academic experience

SLU 1818 courses are similar to those offered on a college campus. Courses can be semesterlong or yearlong and are taught by accredited high school educators.

How is this different from AP or IB?

At the end of the 1818 course, the student receives a grade that reflected on an official SLU transcript. The student may send this transcript to the college or university of their choice when they are ready to transfer their credits. There is no formal examination conducted -- the student takes the course as they would on a college campus.

Who is eligible to participate?

It should be noted that expectations for program participants are high. Qualifying 1818 high school courses maintain the same rigor and demands as courses taught on campus. While our program is mostly open to just juniors and seniors with a GPA 3.0 or higher, certain exceptions may qualify some of our younger students to participate. Upon completion of the program, each 1818 student has an official SLU transcript listing all of their 1818 coursework. This transcript can be easily sent to the student's university of choice to receive credit for their courses.

While our credits transfer most places, it is up to each university to decide if they will accept 1818 credits. Students are responsible for checking to see if 1818 coursework will transfer to their university of choice before registering.
