# Various College Credit Options

- \*Dual Credit (online & on MSD campus)
- \*Advanced Placement
- \*Dual Enrollment (online & on college campus)

## What is a Dual Credit course?

- A college course taught in a high school by certified high school instructor.
- Dual Credit registration is optional.
- Students can earn both high school and college credit.

# Dual Credit Eligibility Requirements

 All students must have permission to participate from a designated school official and a parent/guardian.

 Students must meet the requirements which are determined by the Missouri Coordinating Board for Higher Education.

# **Dual Credit Eligibility** Requirements (cont.)

## Seniors/Juniors

- Automatically eligible with cumulative, unweighted GPA of 3.0
- GPA 2.5-2.99 need a letter of rec from the principal or counselor

## **Sophomores**

- unweighted GPA of 3.0
- Letter of rec from the

### Freshmen

- Must have cumulative, Must have cumulative, unweighted GPA of 3.0
  - Score in the 90th percentile on ACT/SAT
  - principal or counselor Letter of rec from the principal or counselor

# **Advanced Placement (AP) Program**

- Created by the College Board
  - SAT, PSAT, Advanced Placement, CLEP

 Offers college-level curricula and examinations to high school students

- Exams are rigidly scheduled the first two weeks of May.
  - Scored on a scale of 1-5
  - Scores of 3-5 may qualify for college credit

# **Dual Enrollment**

 Student attends a Community College or University while in high school.

 Courses are taught by a professor at the college campus or online.

 Students must apply to the college's dual enrollment/early college program.

# Which Credits will Transfer?

- For AP, Dual Credit, & Dual Enrollment courses, students should check the websites of potential colleges before signing up to verify the transferability of credits.
- Search for the "transfer equivalency" information on the college's website or contact the admissions office via phone or email.
- CORE 42 credits transfer to all MO public colleges/universities
- Pay attention to all Dual Credit/Dual Enrollment procedures, drop deadlines, and payment schedules.

# Comparing AP to DC/DE

## **Advanced Placement**

- \*Exam score may earn college credit, depending on AP exam score and university standards.
- \*Test Cost = approximately \$100 per test
- \*Run by College Board Companyno college affiliation

## Dual Credit/Dual Enrollment

- \*Successful completion of the course earns college credit at given university and may also transfer to other colleges.
- \*Cost per Credit Hour = approximately \$70 per credit hour
- \*Part-time college student--take advantage of campus libraries/labs/etc.



# Finding a Path to a Future Career

- \*Students should use their SCOIR and Missouri Connections accounts to research career and college options.
- \*Students should develop their Individual Career and Academic Plans to assist them in thinking about courses necessary to prepare them for their post-secondary opportunities.
- \*Students should investigate which exams are needed (ACT, SAT, WorkKeys, Accuplacer) and how best to prepare for those exams.



# Finding Balance Between Rigor & Relevance

\*Students should choose courses which will challenge them, prepare them for the future, and in which they can be successful.

\*Students need to evaluate the time each course will take outside of school to develop a time management plan. If there will not be a realistic amount of time for studying, students need to prioritize which advanced courses will be most beneficial (whether that be courses in a potential major or courses they can finish prior to college).

## Early College Program

- Earn an Associate's degree and HS diploma at the same time
- Full-time college student during 11th and 12 grade
- Selective admissions Mehlville S.D. covers the cost of tuition and books
- Transfer degrees designed to transfer credit to 4-year universities
- Access to the same college resources as traditional college students

- Take up to 18 credits per semester
- Tuition and books are NOT COVERED
- Discounted tuition rate (\$72.50 per credit)
- 10th, 11th, 12 grade with 2.0 GPA
- Must have school and caretaker permission

### What Does Access Point do?






